Serged Utensil Roll

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Keep your utensils in order on the go! No need to shop around for a utensil carrying apparatus make your own from an old pair of jeans and other fabric scraps hanging around. The perfect addition to any picnic kit!

Skill Level: Beginner

Janome Supplies:

- Serger
- Sewing Machine

Fabric and Notions:

- 12 1/2" x 15 1/2" denim
- 12 1/2" x 15 1/2" cotton print
- 14" x 15 1/2" cotton print
- 3" x 30" cotton print for ties
- 4 spools serger thread in a contrasting color

Supplies:

- Scissors
- Pins
- Seam sealant

Instructions:

- 1. Fold 14" x 15 1/2 1/2" piece in half to 7" x 15 1/2".
- 2. Place on top 12 1/2" x 15 1/2" cotton print, lining up bottom edges with fold in center.



3. Place print on top of denim fabric, wrong sides together and lining up all four sides. Pin in place.



- 4. To make ties, fold t 3" x 30" piece of cotton in half lengthwise and press.
- 5. Fold raw edges into the pressed center and press.



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
6. At sewing machine topstitch along edge.



- 7. Fold tie in half lengthwise and pin to center on one side of denim.
- 8. Serge completely around all four sides of rectangle through all layers, being careful not to catch the ties in opposite side.



9. Find the vertical center and with sewing machine, sew a straight stitch down center through all layers.



- 10. Find center between center seam and edge, mark and sew down through all layers.
- 11. Repeat for other side.

You are now ready to fill with all your utensils and silverware.
