## Quilting the Kaye Wood Way!

Hexagons-easy to cut with the Starmaker ${ }^{\circ} 6$.
Two cuts and you have a perfect hexagon.

## A great class idea-teach this technique!

Give a quick demo or have a hands-on sit-and-sew class.
Make any size hexagons

1. Cut a strip of fabric the height of the desired hexagon size.
2. Fold the strip in half lengthwise.
3. Place the point of the Starmaker 6 at the top of the strip. Mark the position of the fabric fold on the Starmaker ${ }^{\circ} 6$ with tape or a piece of static sticker ${ }^{\text {rTM }}$.


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Hexagons—easy to sew with Kaye's techniques.

1. Lay out your design.
2. There are three different piecing techniques used in sewing hexagons:
a. sew from edge to edge
b. sew from seamline to edge
c. sew from seamline to seamline
3. Sew the hexagons $B, D \& F$ to hexagon $A$, right sides together, from edge to edge. Press the seam allowances away from the center (A).
4. Sew hexagons $\mathrm{C}, \mathrm{E} \& \mathrm{G}$ to hexagon A , right side togther, from seamline to seamline.
Sew with the center hexagon on top, the $C$ hexagon underneath,
Sew from seamline to seamline with a lock stitch at the beginning and end of the seam.
5. Sew the seam between each hexagon, from seamline to edge.


Fold the $A$ hexagon in half.
Bring the edges of the $B$ and $C$ hexagons right sides together.
Hold the seam allowances toward the center (A) hexagon.
Put the needle down exactly on the previous seamline and $1 / 4$ " in from the edge.
Lock stitch and sew to the end. Press seam allowances between hexagons

- Cutting directions-only two cuts needed.
- Sewing directions-no need to mark seamlines.
- Slow-downs, like ripping, are eliminated and inside points will be perfect.
- Hexagons, divided hexagons, hexagon log cabins, honeycombs and fussycut hexagons.
- Quilts, wallhangings, and Christmas Tree Skirts are all included.
- Easy mitered binding technique for hexagon shapes.
