
Kaye Wood Chevron Block


Fabric and Notions:

- Tandem cutting with the Starmaker 5 gives us this interesting chevron design.
- Static Sticker
- 6 fabrics One 1" x 18" strip
- 3 fabrics Two 1" x 18" strips

Instructions:

- Cut each of the 9 fabrics into strips of 1" x 18".
- From each of the top 3 fabrics, cut one more strip (1" x 18"), for a total of 12 strips.
- Sew the strips together.
- Press the seam allowances all in the same direction.
- Use a dry iron and press from the right side.
- Fold the strip set, wrong sides together.
- Place the Starmarker 5 on the right hand side of the strip set with the bottom along the bottom of the strips.
- Cut along the angle of the Starmaker 5.
- Mark the 2" line on a ruler using Static Sticker.
- Place the marked line along the cut edge of the strip set.
- Put the Starmaker 5 against the ruler, remove it and cut the strip. (The Starmaker 5 will ensure an accurate angle.)
- Continue cutting 3 segments from the folded strip set.






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by Kaye Wood www.kayewood.com • Sew the segments together so that the chevron has matching seamlines.

- Press the seam allowances open.
- The easiest way to do this is to press the seam allowances all to one side from the right side of the fabric.
- Then from the back, press the seams open.
- Square up the block to 6 1/2" x 6 1/2".





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
