Fabric and cutting requirements:

From Avocado: Four 2" squares (A)

From Plum: One 2" square (A)
Two 2" x 5" rectangles (B)

From Jewel: One 2" square (A)
Two 2" x 3 1/2" rectangles (C)

From Lagoon: Three 2" squares (A, D)

From Lava: One 2" square (A)

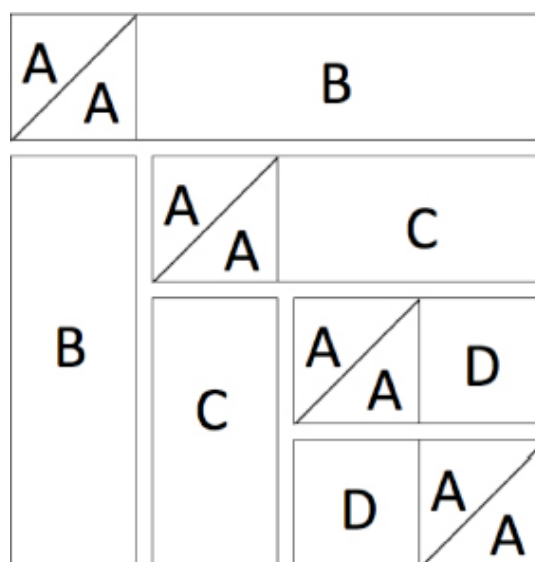

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Constructing the block:

1. Make an half square triangle A/A
2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of piece A. Referring to Diagram 1 below, align one piece A to another piece A and stitch along the marked line. Trim a 1/4" outside of the stitched line and press open. Repeat for all A/A blocks. Trim to a 2" square.

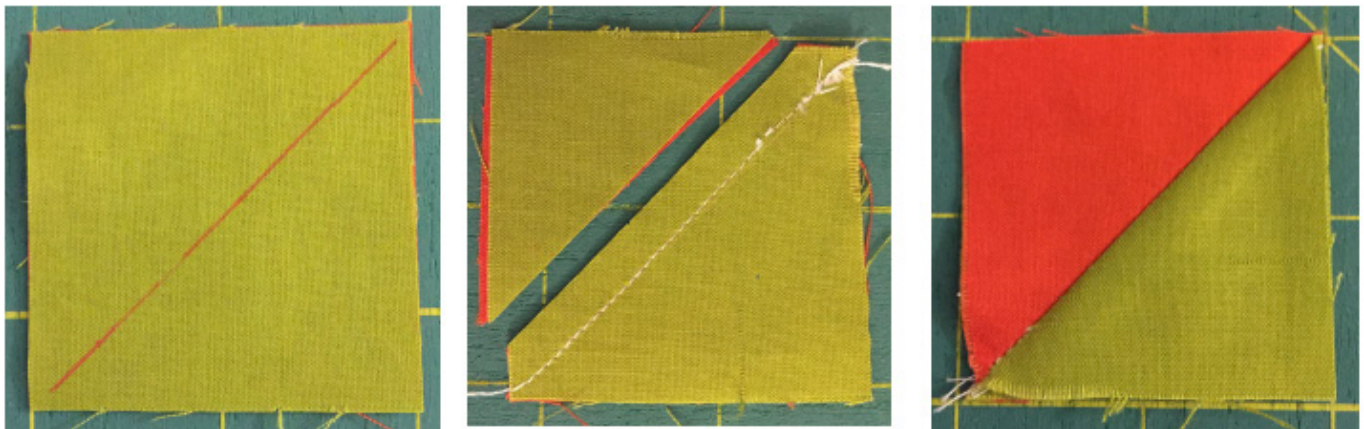

3. Refer to Diagram 2 on the previous page to sew the following pieces together.
4. Piece sections A/D. Press towards D.
5. Piece one section A/C. Press towards C.
6. Piece one section A/B. Press towards B.
7. Sew the two A/D sections together and press.
8. Sew piece C to the side of the A/D section. Press towards C.
9. Sew the A/C section to the top of the block and press.
10. Sew B to the side of the block. Press towards B.
11. Sew piece A/B to the top of the block and press.

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
