








Artisan Curve Peak

Artisan Curves are marked with a centre reference line to alian each rotation point.

Holes are cut at each marked measurement point.


Step1. Mark Crosshair reference lines eq. for an 8 rotation design mark 16 crosshair lines, the additional lines aid in rotation of the design. The Westalee Crosshair Ruler is an easy and accurate way to mark crosshair. reference lines

Step 2. Insert the pin (provided) from under the quilt at the centre point.

Step 3. Place the template over the pin at the size you wish to sew.

> Note: Always quilt the smallest size first and work you way out.

Stitch and Rotate Quiltina




Alian the centre reference line marked through the centre of the tool with the crosshair reference line and sew from reference line to reference line, starting at the bottom right corner (shown in red).


Always stop with the needle down to keep the Ruler Foot in the correct position.






Mini Multi Arc Template

This miniature multi arc template allows you to create 1" - 4" half circle designs.









Outside Design Template Instructions:

These templates will create a variety of designs that can stand alone or be used to offset and echo a specific design.

- 1)Place stable tape on the underside of your template at locations that would be pressure points when holding the template in place while sewing
- 2)Determine the desired placement of your template design within the block
- 3) Place the template at the beginning point of your desired design, using the horizontal etched markings (see A) on the template to align the base of the multi arc design
- a.Make sure that your needle is in the middle of the foot to insure that you are sewing 1/4 inch off the template edge
- b.Place the ruler foot snugly against the template and pull your bobbin thread to the top
- c. Begin sewing keeping the ruler foot touching the template, and tracing around the outside edge of the template
- d. Once you are at the end of the template leave the needle down and move the template $\,$
- 4) You may need to use a straight edge template to stitch above the multi arc to create your next layer
- a. Using the vertical etched markings (see B), line up a low vertical marking if ended on a high vertical marking, or vice versa, and repeat this pattern until the end of the design, or the end of the block, the goal to have an offset design.


Back to Back

The Westalee Design Back to Back Template was 1 of the first Templates for which we use our original Foot Rests. There are 12 Templates in the Back to Back Series, with a different curve on each side of the Template we have 24 variations.


Each of the Templates in the Series has 1 width and 2 depths giving you more options.

Quilt Curved Lines, Back to Back Curved Lines, Melons or Orange Peel in blocks. For even more Creativity use more than 1 size.

The instructions shown are for a 1" Back to Back - all Back to Back Templates are used in the same manner.



1/4" reference lines allow you more creativity



These Reference Lines are the Centre of the Stitched Design.
